Addiction and Recovery

Presented by G. Daniel Neel, CACII

Presented by Stephen F. Compton, MSW, LISW-CP

This session offers a total of 6 hours.

Part 2: Antisocial Men: Diagnosis and Treatment, 1:30-4:30 pm

Session Description:

- Introduction to new psychology of men
- Identify barriers to working effectively with men
- Learn new techniques in counseling with men
- Part Two - Diagnose antisocial personality disorder and related disorders
- Identify personal barriers that arise in working with this population
- Overcoming barriers to empathy
- Employ counseling techniques that work and discard those that do not
- Employ effective group therapy techniques with this population

About the Presenter:

Stephen F. Compton is a Licensed Independent Social Worker who works with adolescents, adults, and families. With over 30 years of experience, Steve is particularly interested in men's issues, anger management, spirituality, trauma, and coping with grief. He is a member of the National Association of Social Workers, the Academy of Certified Social Workers, and the South Carolina Society of Clinical Social Workers.

Applying Ethics in Clinical Settings

Presented by Christopher Jackson, NCACI, CACII, D.O.T. S.A. P.

This session offers a total of 3 hours and meets the

SCAADAC/NAADAC Ethics requirements for recertification.

Session Description:

At the end of this session, the alcohol and drug abuse professional will:

- Have acquired a greater understanding of Ethics as it pertains to substance abuse treatment settings.
- Have experienced, through examination of real-case scenarios, the challenge of making judgments and decisions across a broad range of ethical issues faced by AOD clinicians.
- Leave with more confidence in being sensitive to and making reasoned, ethics-driven choices about such situations.

The workshop will use case examples, some role play and group discussion to help the AOD counselor examine and deal with ethical issues in his/her daily practice.

IMPORTANT: Each participant is asked to bring with her/him, written on a small piece of paper, but not signed, a real-life example from her/his professional experience, of a situation in which an ethics issue arose, whether or not that issue was settled.

About the Presenter:

Christopher (Christo) Jackson has for nine years been a full-time clinician for the Beaufort County Alcohol and Drug Abuse Agency, where he manages a roster of adult Clients, and co-facilitates that Agency's Intensive Outpatient Program. In 2007, he was named by DAODAS as IOP Counselor of the Year. Christo has served the SCAADAC Board as Membership Chair, and currently is SCAADAC Board Member and Secretary.

Spirituality

Session Description:

Spirituality is often misunderstood to be something that only good people do. In this brief session spirituality will be discussed and presented in a practical manner that is simple to teach those in recovery. Those attending this session will be able to understand the following objectives:

- Understand the difference between spirituality and religion
- Understand how spirituality is part of their everyday life
- Understand how spirituality is the basis of the 12 Step Program
- Understand the motivators of spiritual behaviors
- Understand how memory, beliefs, and triggers inhibit spiritual progress
- Understand how to present this material to those in recovery

Clinical Supervision

Presented by Barbara Melton, MEd, LPC, LPCS, NCC/MAC, CACII

This session offers a total of 6 hours.

Session Description:

This is a fast-paced, interesting workshop which incorporates video vignettes and case histories showing a variety of settings where supervisors may encounter situations that will test their skills!

Objectives:

Upon completion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Prepare supervisees to handle sexual Attraction issues in therapy
- Help supervisees handle anger in therapy sessions
- Assist supervisees with boundary issues
- Model for supervisees how to handle crises/emergencies
- Discuss differential diagnosis between substance use disorders and other mental health disorders
- Prepare supervisees for written and oral exams for CAC

About the Presenter:

Barbara Melton has a private practice in downtown Charleston and works with adult populations on a number of issues, including trauma and loss. She supervises the clinical staff at the Dorchester Alcohol & Drug Commission as well as at the Ernest Kennedy Center, and does in-services and consultation work for Clinical Solutions. She is also an LPC supervisor. She has also taught Psycho-Diagnostics and Psychopathology for Columbia College and Coastal Carolina University and is currently teaching a Clinical Supervision course for Webster University.

HIV 201, Beyond the Basics

Presented by Ed Johnson, LPC, MAC, CACII,

This session offers a total of 3 hours and meets the SCAADAC/NAADAC HIV requirements for initial certification.

Session Description:

Whether clients are infected or affected, HIV/AIDS is increasingly an AOD Treatment issue. Through this Workshop, Clinicians will:

- Increase their knowledge of why AOD clients are at higher risk for HIV Infection and more rapid onset of AIDS.
- Learn how to more accurately assess HIV Infection risk in AOD Clients and motivate them to be tested for HIV
- Increase their knowledge HIV and current pharmacological interventions

- Increase their knowledge of how to incorporate an HIV Risk Reduction message into AOD Treatment.

About the Presenter:

Ed obtained a Bachelor's Degree from Auburn University and a Masters Degree in Clinical Counseling from the Citadel. He has worked as Client Services Coordinator at Lowcountry AIDS Services and since June 1992 in various positions at Charleston Center (Charleston County Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services). In November 1999 he assumed duties as Program Administrator for the Opioid Treatment Program and Infectious Disease Service at Charleston Center. He has worked extensively with individuals infected with and affected by HIV. He has provided numerous trainings in South Carolina on HIV/Addiction, Opioid Dependency/Treatment and issues related to Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) Individuals and Addiction. He is currently credentialed/licensed as a Master Addiction Counselor (MAC), a Certified Addictions Counselor (CACII), and a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC).

ASAM PPC-2 Practical Applications

Presented by Lawrence Wiseburn, LISW, MAC

This session offers a total of 3 hours.

Session Description:

Principles of ASAM will be examined through didactic presentation, small group exercises and discussion focusing on the six dimensions and patient placement criteria. Additionally, emphasis will be placed on the Prochaska and Diclemente Stages of Change model (motivational interviewing) as a way to enhance treatment effectiveness, to engage the client as a participant in the treatment process and assist in patient placement.

About the Presenter:

Lawrence Wiseburn is a licensed social worker and NAADAC certified Master Addiction Counselor with 23 years experience in addictions. He has a Bachelor of Science degree from the United States Air Force Academy and Masters of Social Work degree from the University of South Carolina. Lawrence is currently the clinical supervisor at Starting Point of Florence and Executive Director of Faces and Voices of Recovery Pee Dee. He is a member of the Board of Faces and Voices of Recovery South Carolina, Open Arms Recovery Center and the Circle Park Advisory Board. Lawrence is co-author of the current ASAM system for Medicaid utilization review for the State of South Carolina.

- Spouses (Families) Left Behind During Deployments
- Children and Domestic Violence
- Alcohol and Drug Abuse with Veterans
- Homelessness Amongst Military Veterans
- Working Through the Red Tape of Tri Care

About the Presenter:

Glynis Matthews is a former Marine. He received a football scholarship to Charleston Southern University where he received a Bachelors of Arts in Social Science. He later received his Masters degree in counseling from Webster University. Cultural Sensitivity with Latino and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) Clients

Presented by Ralph Rynes, PhD, CACII

This session offers a total of 6 hours.

Session Description:

This course will provide both practitioners and administrators increased familiarity with the issues and barriers faced by Latino lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) individuals in need of substance abuse disorders treatment. Attendees will develop familiarity and knowledge about the interaction between LGBT issues and substance use disorders. The curriculum offers skill building knowledge enhancing practical skills to offer sensitive affirmative, culturally relevant and effective treatment to LGBT individuals in substance use disorders treatment.

About the Presenter:

Dr. Ralph Rynes is the HIV/AIDS Program Director for LRADAC and Treatment Consultant at the USC School of Medicine. He completed his doctorate specializing in Neurology/Neuroscience from the Unversite' Denis Diderot in Paris, France. He has worked with addicted patients both in the US and in France for over 30 years, and with HIV infected patients for the last 20 years. He is a member of IAPAC, IDSA, NALGAP, NAADAC, SCAADAC, IBRO and a Fellow of the Cognitive Neuroscience Society and holds NCAC certification.
